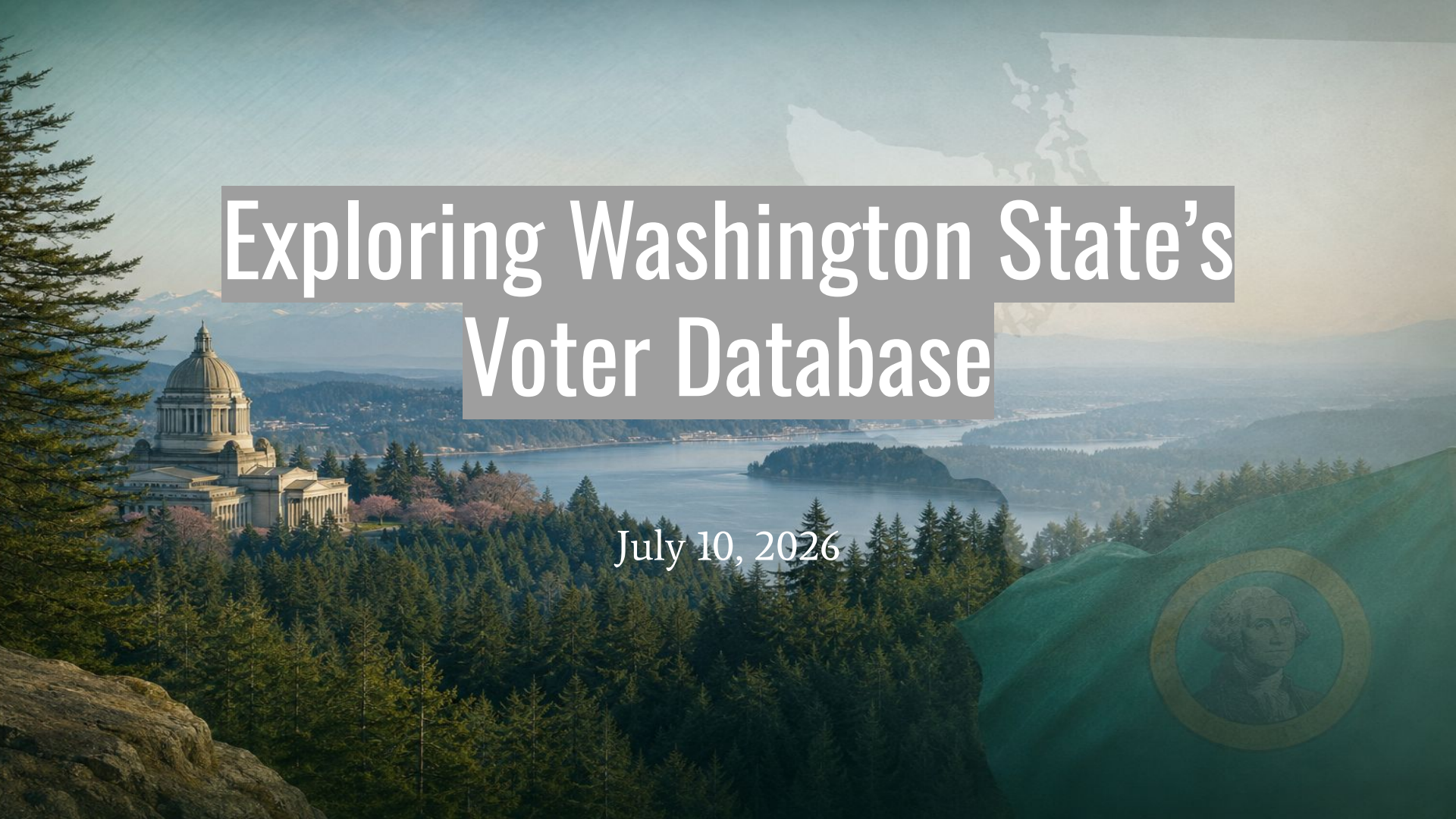

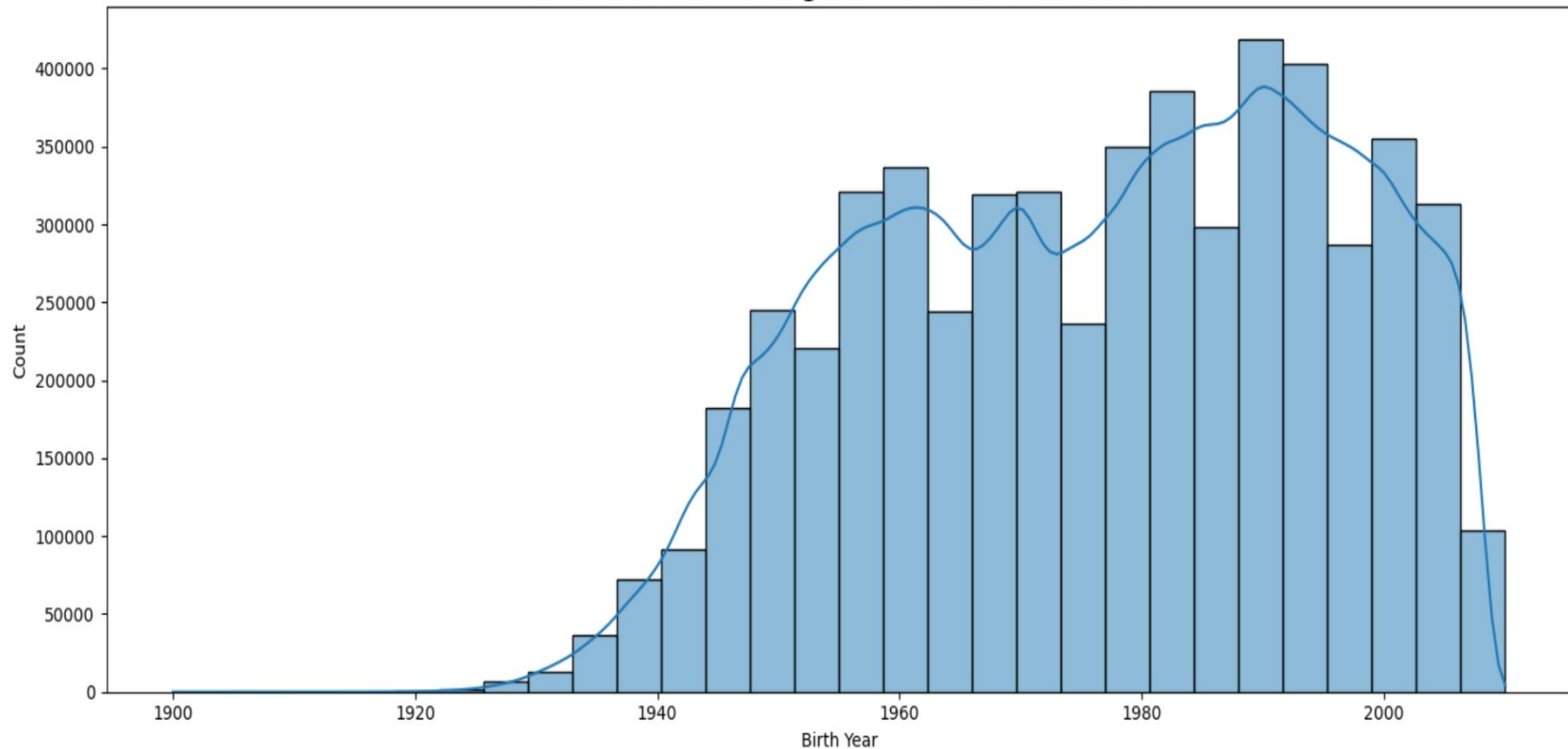

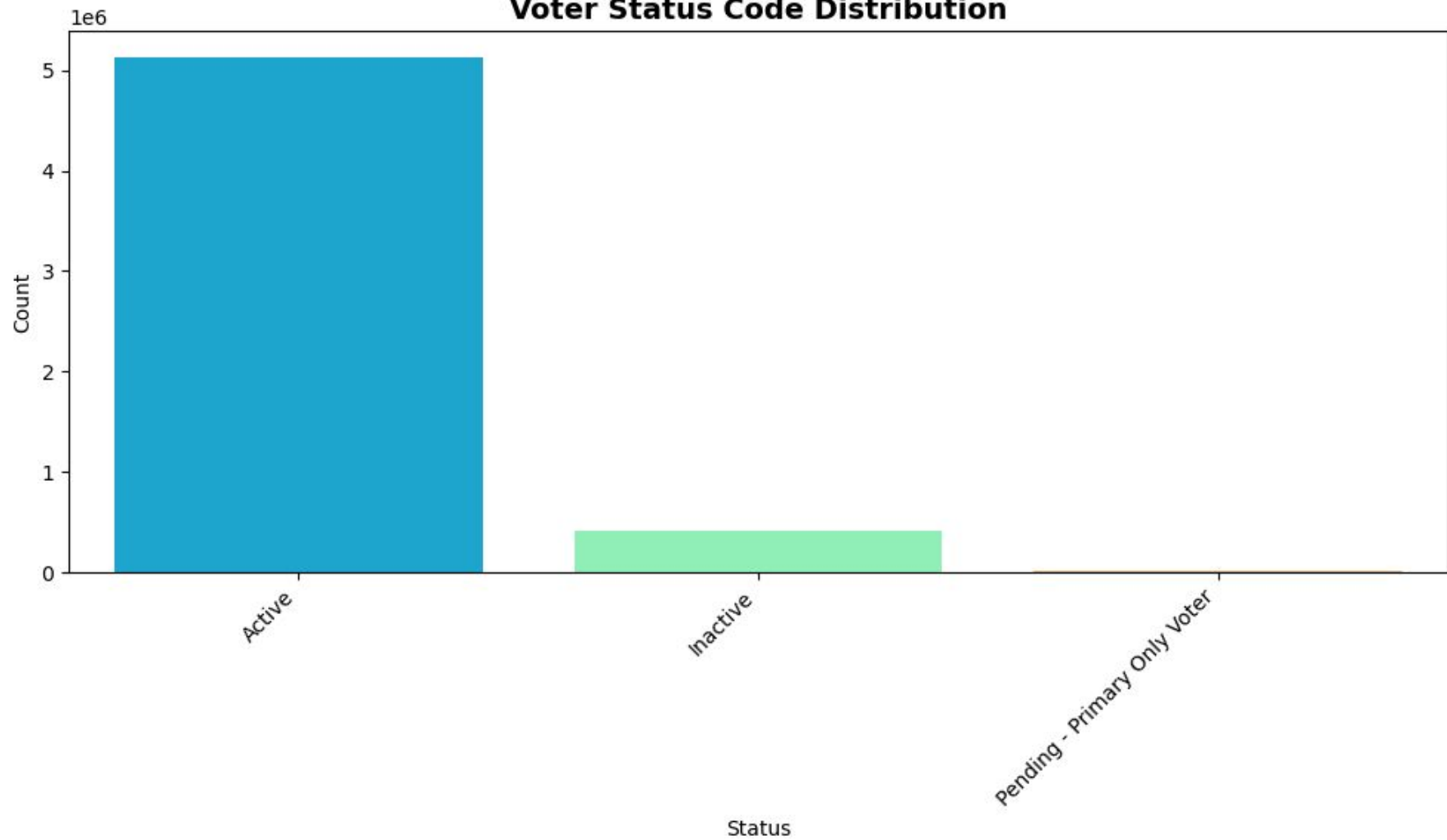

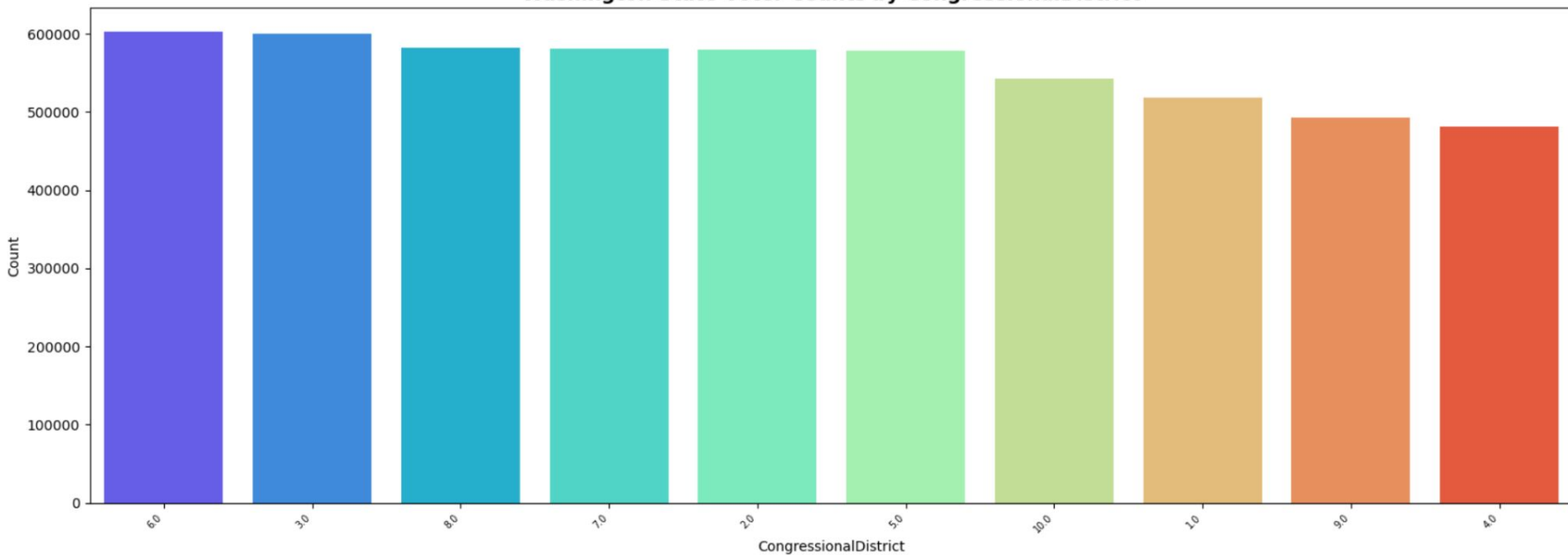
Distribution of Washington State Voter Birth Years



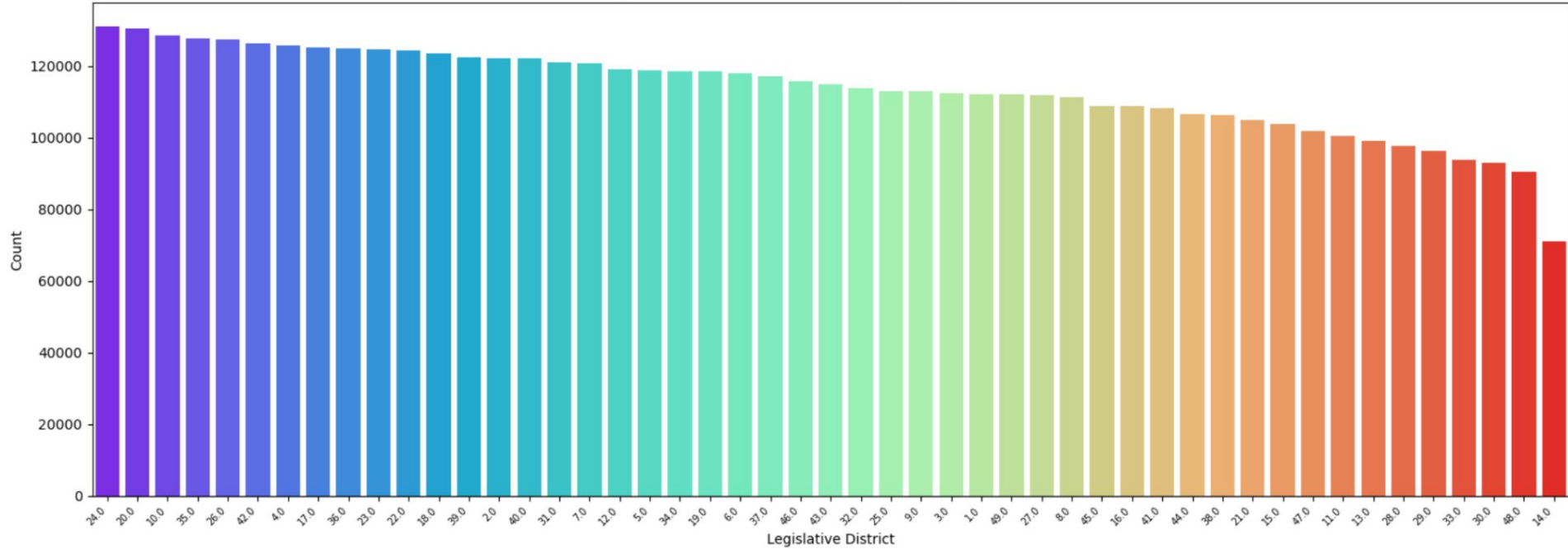
Voter Status Code Distribution



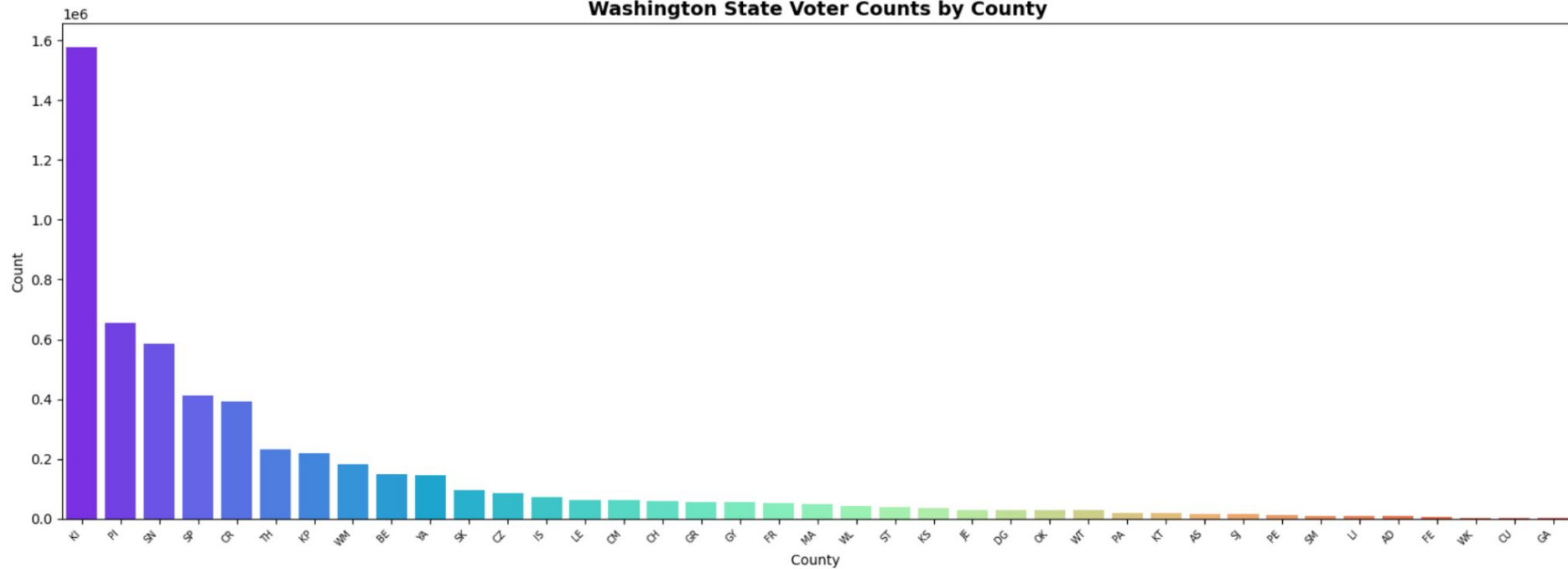
Washington State Voter Counts by CongressionalDistrict



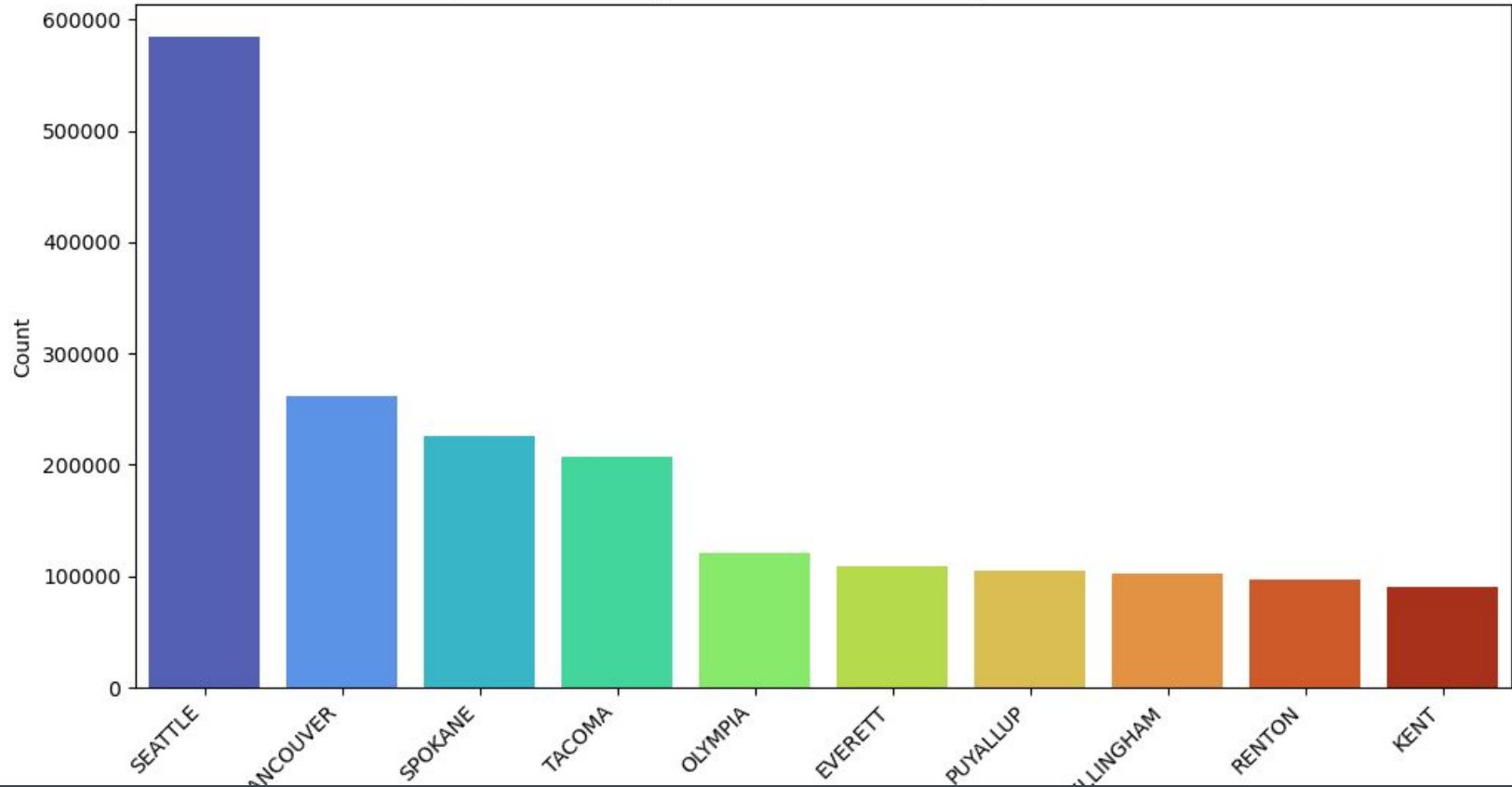
Washington State Voter Counts by Legislative District



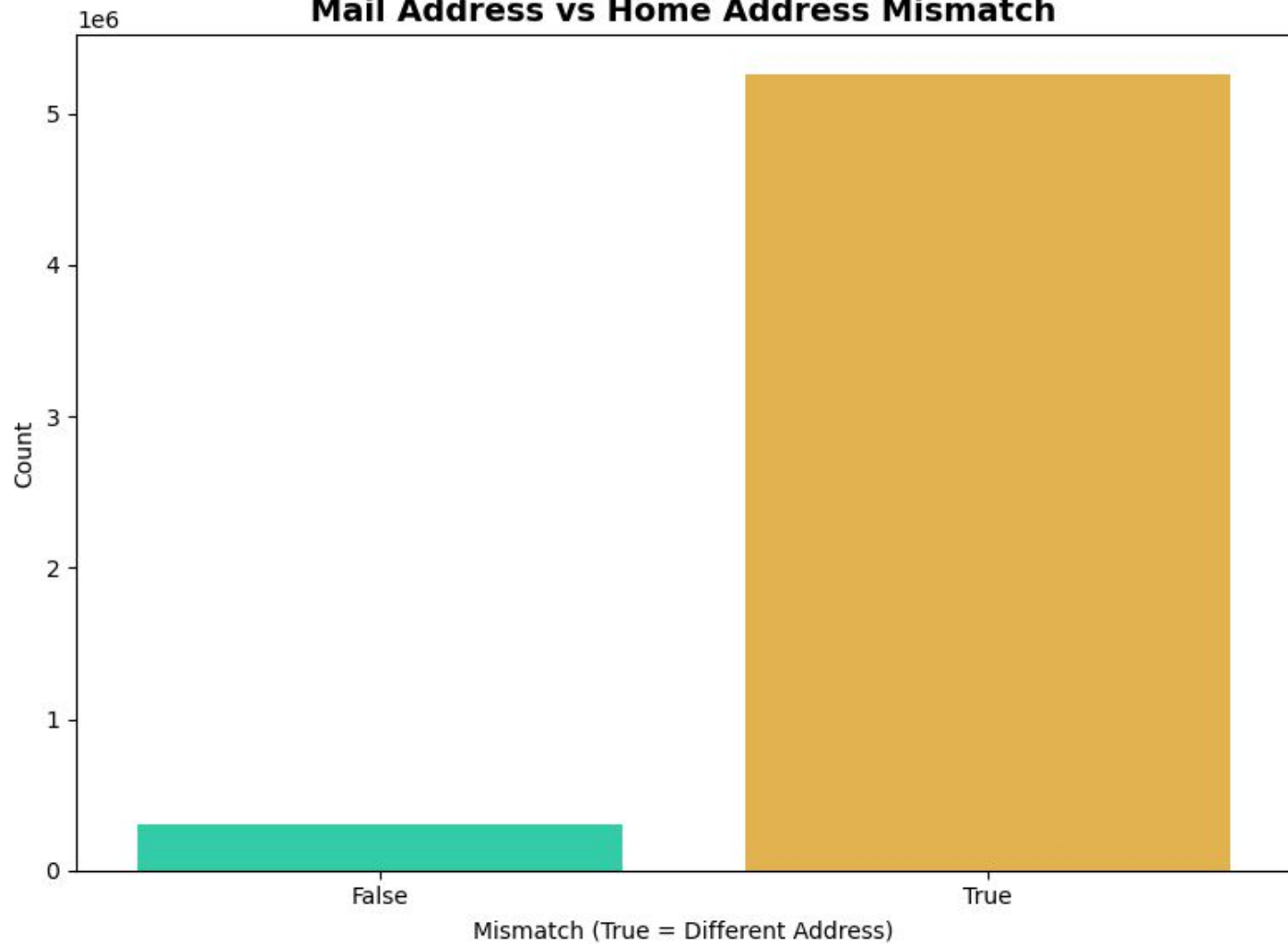
Washington State Voter Counts by County
